A panel of SORH leaders, experts and a variety of guest speakers will lead in-person learning sessions and webinars on a wide range of pertinent topics and best practices. #### **About the RHC Institute**

Who should attend the Institute? The RHC Institute is designed for SORH staff interested in providing technical assistance to RHCs.

What will participants learn? Participants will be provided with resources, guidance, and best practices for organizing their efforts to provide effective technical assistance and serve as valuable resources for RHCs.

### **Prevalent RHC Needs: Understanding the challenges and barriers faced by RHCs**

The first webinar of the RHC Institute will focus on the needs, barriers, and challenges of RHCs. Needs vary from state to state and each clinic has unique challenges, however, data demonstrate there are national trends and common issues. This session will provide an overview of existing needs assessment data, provide information on the impact of changing marketplace, new reimbursement methods and regulatory environment on RHC and will offer guidance to assist SORHs in learning about the specific needs of RHCs in their states.

### **December 3, 2015 Providing Technical Assistance to RHCs Part 1**

During this two-part series, participants will learn about options for providing high-level technical assistance to RHCs and hear about best practices from SORHs with experience in these areas. Examples include revenue cycle management (coding/billing/reimbursement), cost reporting, operational improvements, and compliance.

## December 17, 2015 Providing Technical Assistance to RHCs Part 2

Part 2 will include additional technical assistance offerings such as Patient Centered Medical Home (PCMH) recognition, quality improvement, technology or telehealth implementation, integrating oral and behavioral health, board governance, leadership training, and provider & staff recruitment.

# January 7, 2016 Other Options for SORHs in Supporting RHCs

This webinar will give SORHs suggestions for providing support to RHCs that do not involve high level, direct technical assistance, such as conferences, webinars, and information dissemination (social media and newsletters).

# January 21, 2016 RHC Conditions of Participation and Compliance Part 1

Participants will review the CMS Conditions of Participation and learn about the requirements for RHC organizational structure, physical plant/safety, and staffing responsibilities. This session will include basic training on how to conduct mock surveys based on CMS guidelines.

# February 4, 2016 RHC Conditions of Participation and Compliance Part 2

During Part 2 of "Conditions of Participation and Compliance" the Provision of Services regulations will be covered, as well as Patient Health Records. In addition, participants will gain an understanding for the requirements for the RHC Program Evaluation.

## February 18, 2016 Collaboration and Partnerships

Participants will be provided with guidance on the organizations and experts to connect with to effectively support RHCs. Innovative partnerships built through collaboration at the state and national levels are key to strengthening RHCs. Information will be provided regarding state RHC associations and others such as the State Rural Health Associations, Primary Care Offices, and Primary Care Associations.

#### March 3, 2016 Understanding RHC Advocacy and Policy Efforts

Bill Finerfrock, Executive Director of the National Association of Rural Health Clinics, will inform participants about current legislative and policy issues at the national level, and provide an overview of opportunities for SORHs to become involved in advocacy efforts.

# March 17, 2016 Assisting Communities with Developing and Supporting RHCs

Rural communities are challenged with determining the appropriate primary care delivery model to meet the needs of the population and ensure long-term sustainability. Participants will discuss how to help communities decide if RHC is the right fit for the local primary care clinic and learn how to assist with conducting financial feasibility studies. Participants will learn to assist clinics that decide to pursue RHC status with preparing for the survey & certification process and planning for ongoing compliance and sustainability. In addition, this session will cover the process of transitioning from RHC to FQHC and freestanding RHC to provider-based.
