Conditions in the places where people live, learn, work, and play affect a wide range of health risks and outcomes.¹ These conditions are known as social determinants of health (SDOH).

We know that poverty limits access to healthy foods and safe neighborhoods and that more education is a predictor of better health.²³⁴ We also know that differences in health are striking in communities with poor SDOH such as unstable housing, low income, unsafe neighborhoods, or substandard
