The Federal Office of Rural Health Policy (FORHP)

Created

- In1987
- To advise the Secretary of Health on rural health issues
- To coordinate activities related to rural health care within the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services.

Purpose

- Part of the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA)
- FORHP has department-wide responsibility for analyzing the possible effects of policy on 62 million residents of rural communities.

Mission

To improve access to quality health care in rural communities



FY 2016 Competitive Grant Programs

Telehealth Network Grant Program

- 3 years
- \$250,000 per year
- To demonstrate the use of telehealth networks that improve health care for medically underserved people
- Eligibility: nonprofit entities that will provide services to rural communities through a telehealth network
- FOA available: Winter 2016
- Start date: September 2016

Telehealth Resource Center Grant Program

- 3 years
- \$350,000 per year
- To support Telehealth Resource Centers to provide TA for telehealth implementation
- Eligibility: nonprofit entities, including faith-based, community-based, and tribal nonprofit organizations
- FOA available: Winter 2016
- Start date: September 2016

FY 2016 Competitive Grant Programs

Small Health Care Provider Quality Improvement Grant Program

- 3 years, \$150,000 per year
- ~ 30 awards
- To support the delivery of primary care/ outpatient health care services in rural communities
 - Provider focused
 - Evidence-based
 - HIT usage required for data collection
 - Outcomes oriented (patient engagement, care coordination)
- Eligibility: rural, non-profit entity, partner with 2 other entities
- FOA Available: Winter 2015
- Start Date: August 2016

Rural Health Network Development Planning Program

- 1 year, \$100,000
- ~ 15 awards
- Help to promote the planning and development of healthcare networks
- Eligibility: rural, non-profit or public entity
- Proposed addition: some focus on hospital closure prevention
- FOA Available: Fall 2015
- Start Date: June 2016

FY 2016 Competitive Grant Programs

Rural Network Development Program

- 3 years, \$300,000 per year
- ~ 30 awards
- To increase access to and quality of health care in rural areas
- Eligibility: Rural lead applicant, network made up of at least 3 separate health care entities that demonstrate successful history of 3+ years prior collaboration
- FOA Available: September 2016,
- Start Date: May 2017

Delta States Rural Development Network Grant Program

- 3 years, up to \$460,000 per year
- ~ 12 awards
- To deliver health care services in rural communities in the Delta
 - Evidence-based
 - Outcomes oriented
 - Defined service area
 - Proposed Secondary Focuschildhood poverty
- Eligibility: rural, non-profit or public entity, partners with members
- FOA Available: Winter 2015
- Start Date: August 2016
