

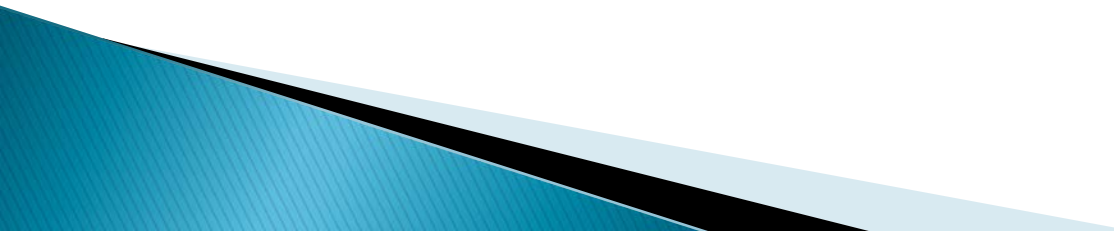






Who We Are

- ▶ Over 3,238 patients have been served
- ▶ Over 13,637 appointments made by APA staff
- ▶ 607 physicians/health care providers donate their services on a rotating basis
- ▶ New Dental “pay it forward” program
- ▶ **Total value of donated care – over \$44 million** (January 2006-September 2015)

▶ January 2006 – June 2016



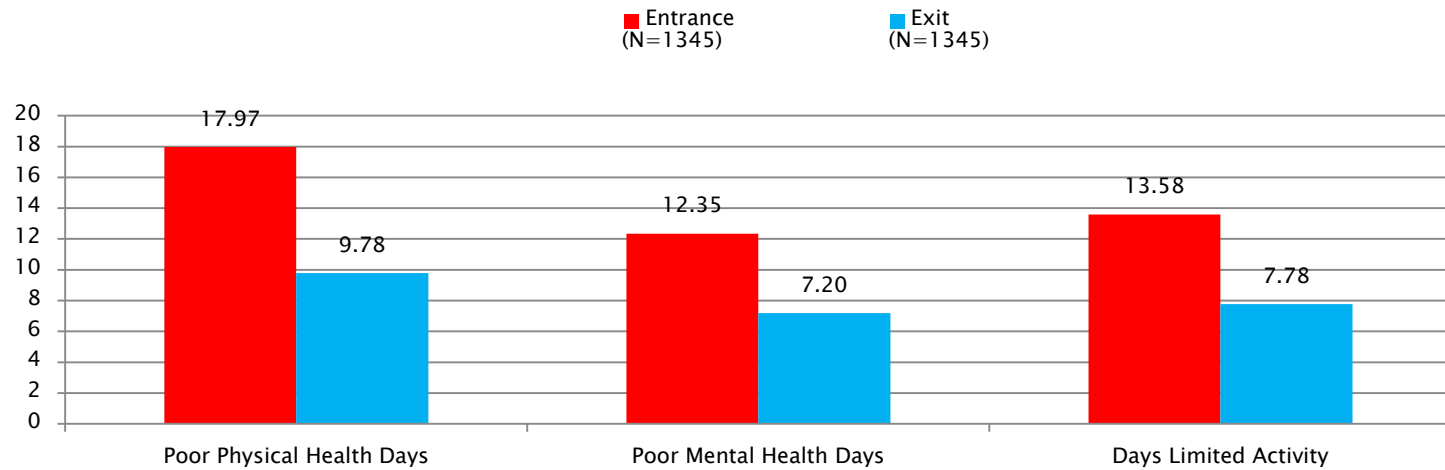
Dental “Pay it Forward”

- ▶ Based on 8-year old program from Battle Creek, Michigan
- ▶ Referrals originate from Providence ED
- ▶ Recruitment underway
 - Currently have 18 volunteer dentists pledging over 1700 services
- ▶ Patient does community service prior to dental work
 - Exception: emergent situations
- ▶ Funding secured from United Way when program begins

January 2006 – June 2016

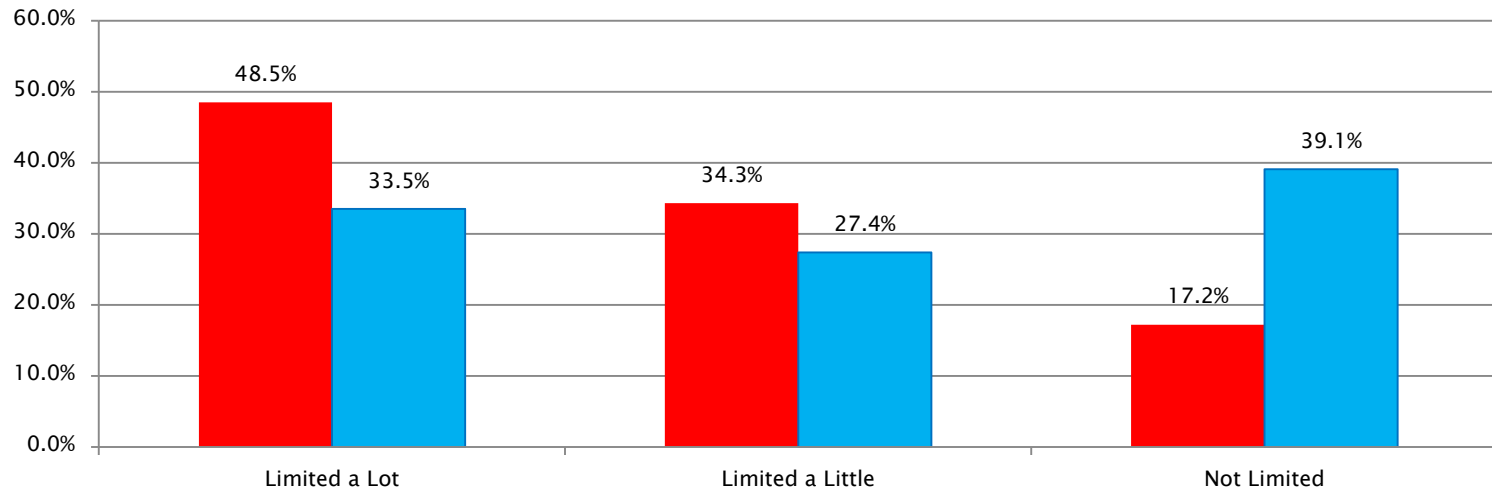

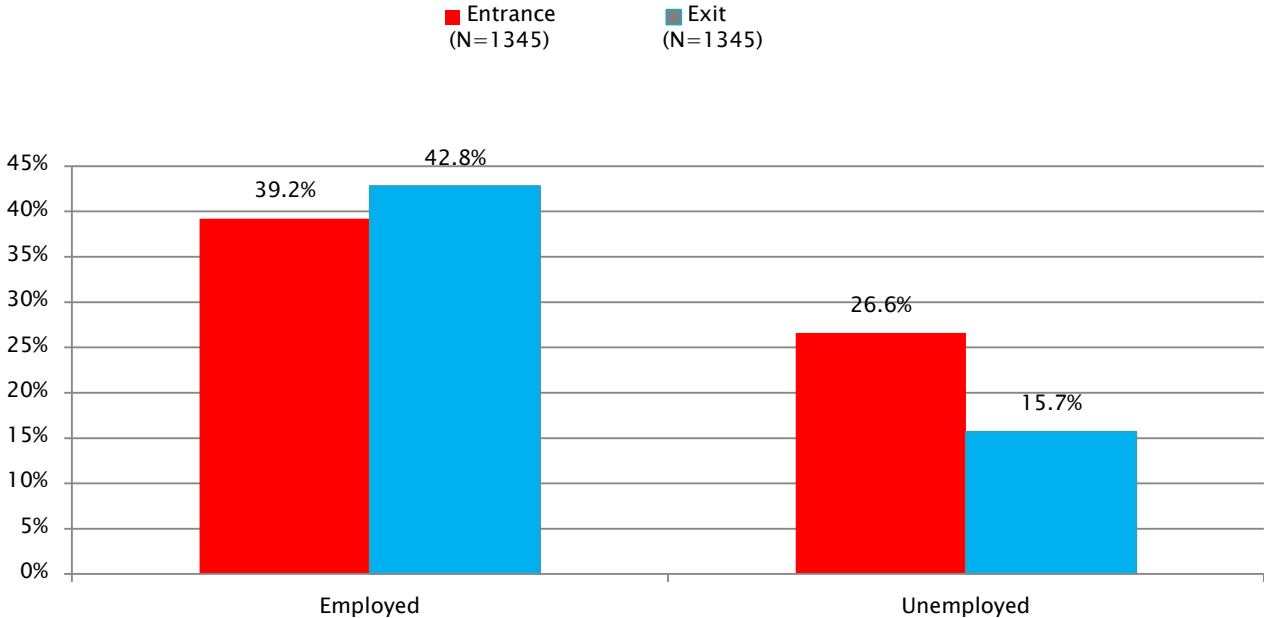
■ Entrance (N=1345) ■ Exit (N=1345)

Employment Status

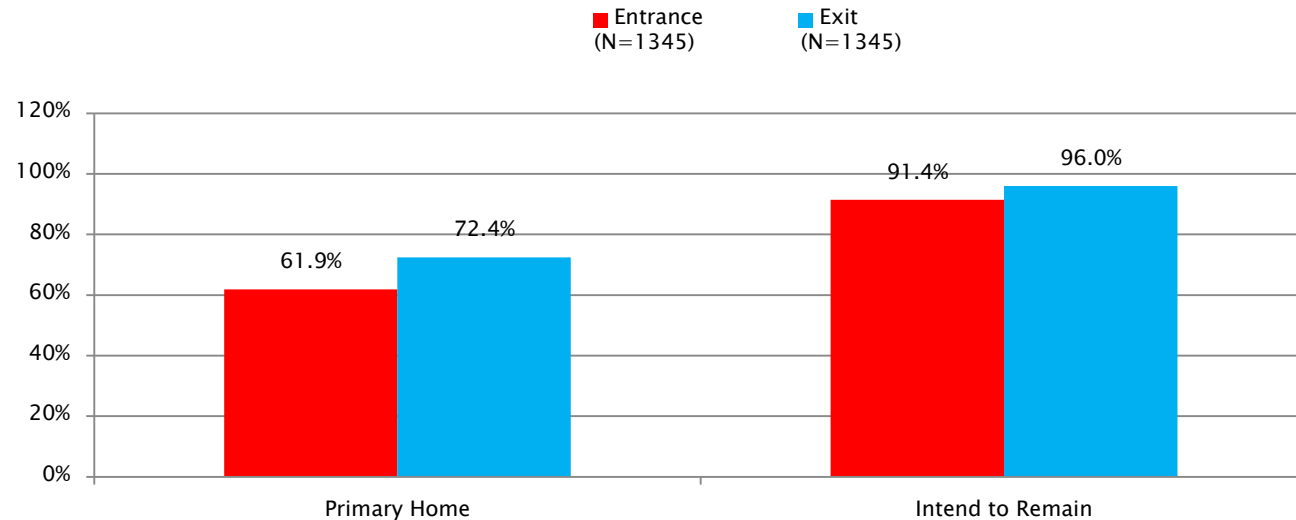
Employment Status

January 2006 – June 2016



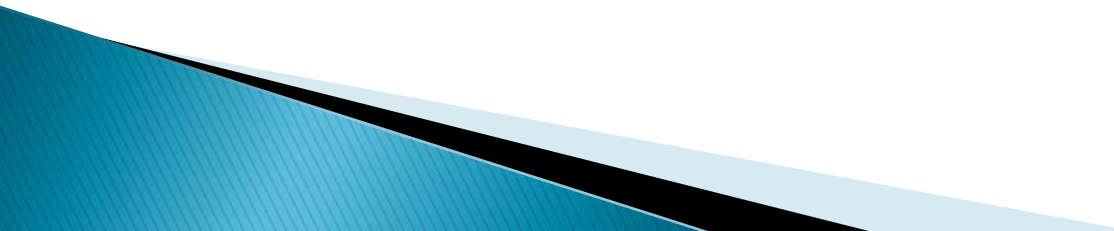
Percent of respondent reporting using Community Health Centers as primary care home and intention to remain. 100% of patients have primary care.

Partnership with Clark & Begich School Based Health Centers

- ▶ **School Based Health Centers offer services to 6-8 grade students at Clark and Begich Middle Schools.**
 - Services include immunizations, sports physicals, diagnosis and treatment of minor illness and injury
- ▶ **Anchorage Project Access Partnership**
 - Ensures low income children without insurance who are seen at the health center are able to fill prescriptions and receive follow on care
 - Extends reach of APA to more qualifying children
 - Shares APA expertise with provider recruitment, provider relations



The Evolution of Anchorage Project Access

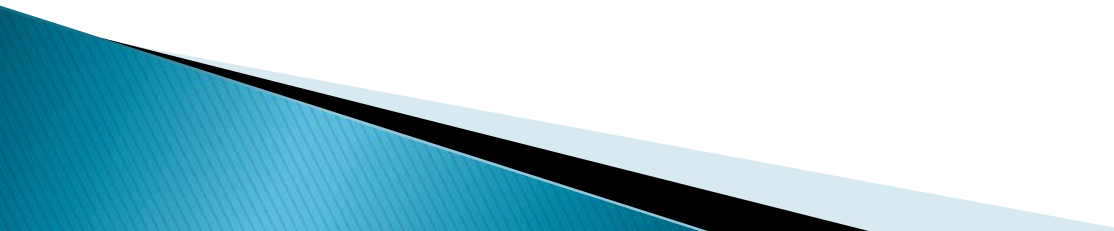
- ▶ Two APA staff are Certified Application Counselors (CACs)
