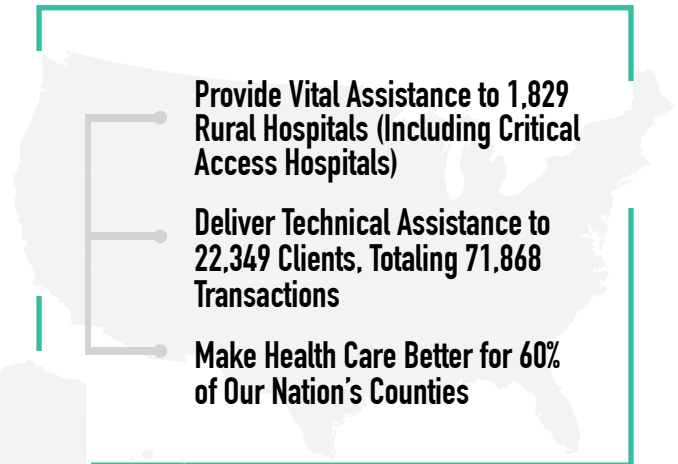
No Other Resource Does the Work of a SORH

State Offices of Rural Health are the lead coordinators of health care delivery in our Nation's rural communities. SORHs collect and disseminate data which **informs** public policy decisions that **impact** rural providers, provide technical assistance that **improves** quality of care, aids in health care provider recruitment and workforce development, and **builds and expands** access to life-saving health care services for rural populations.
