### Rural Communities Opioid Response Program (RCORP)

- Multi-year \$440 million initiative developed in FY18
- Provides funding and technical assistance directly to rural communities to strengthen their capacity to address the opioid epidemic.

### **RCORP**

- 1420+ counties served across 48 states and territories (including Puerto Rico and the Northern Mariana Islands)
- 483 total awards since inception
- Additional programs to be awarded in FY21 (September)
  - Implementation, Psychostimulant Support





### **RCORP**

#### **Accomplishments**

#### In their first year, FY19 RCORP grantees:

- Screened 453,686 individuals for SUD
- Provided direct services to 366,871 rural residents, including:
  - 123,463 individuals newly diagnosed with an SUD
  - 23,605 individuals received MAT services
- Delivered stigma reduction training to 21,381 rural residents
- Made 3,793 referrals to transportation services (the most common type of referral)





### **CARES Act Funds to Support Tribes**

**Rural Tribal COVID-19 Response Program** 

- The RTCR program allows for maximum flexibility to prevent, prepare for, and respond to COVID-19
  - PPE, workforce support, test kits, telehealth, mobile clinics, vaccination efforts, etc
- Program awarded in record time two months from appropriation to award date
  - FORHP held numerous consultation calls with Tribes and tribal representatives
  - Consulted with IHS
- \$16.3 million awarded to 57 Tribes and tribal organizations across 21 states
